May 27-June 6 – 8:00AM-12:30PM

302 Church History 2 – Professor Eric Lehner

This class is a study of church history from the Reformation to the 1900s.

352 Systematic 2 – Professor Tom Dailey

This course will survey the doctrines of man, sin and the Holy Spirit, highlighting the cessationist and noncessationist views on spiritual gifts.

June 16-20 – 8:00AM-12:30PM

251 New Testament Introduction – Dr. Dan Ebert

This course in New Testament Introduction approaches the text from a confessing theological perspective, and then examines textual, literary, and historical questions. Its purpose is to prepare students for the faithful study and proclamation of the NT message.

June 16-27 – 8:00AM-12:30PM

121 Biblical Counseling for the Home – Dr. Jim Newcomer

Against the backdrop of the reality that all relationships within the home are to be relationships of discipleship, *Biblical Counseling for the Home* will prepare the student to address the major issues surrounding pre-marital, marriage and parenting.

202 Old Testament Introduction – Dr. John Klem

Old Testament Introduction examines the critical problems of the OT canon and text (General Introduction), surveys the critical methodologies of OT analysis, and investigates major historical and chronological issues of the Old Testament.

July 7-18 – 8:00AM-12:30PM

681 Patristics – Dr. Michael Windsor

This course will examine the epoch of the Church Fathers. How was theology and ministry shaped in the early centuries of Christianity?

May 12-June 27 – ONLINE

355 Dispensationalism – Professor Tom Dailey

This course will examine and apply the fundamental distinctive that separates dispensational and nondispensational systems of theology.

200 Hermeneutics – Dr. Jack Klem

This course introduces students to the theory and practice of Biblical interpretation.

August 18-22 – 8:00AM-1:00PM

180 Leadership Seminar– Dr. Tom Keiser

This course will review some of the basic principles of leadership with a focus on practical implementation, e.g., management by objectives, staff relations, managing critical financial matters, communication, hospitality, public relations, etc.
